Travel Trade Information



Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump was designated an UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1981. The award winning interpretive centre was built into the hillside to blend into the natural sandstone cliffs.

The interpretive centre is open year-round and is located 90 minutes south of Calgary, or just 1 hour northeast of Waterton Lakes National Park. The centre features 5 levels of exhibits, an 80 seat movie theatre, and gift shop showcasing authentic First Nations arts and crafts. The 60 seat cafeteria is equipped to cater to groups onsite if reserved in advance. The interpretive centre and upper trail viewpoint are fully wheel chair accessible.

The new Piskun program (**The Buffalo Jump**) will occur every Monday and Friday in July and August, from 1 pm to 4 pm. This program can also be booked in advance for groups of 15 to 30 people. Visitors will connect with the buffalo hunting culture, through the spiritual Blackfoot smudge ceremony, by tasting dried buffalo meat, by playing a role in the buffalo hunt re-enactment, and by learning how to hit a target with the ancient spear thrower (atlatl).

For adventurous hikers, the four-hour *Hike to the Drive Lanes* program is offered every other Saturday from mid May through September, 10:30am - 2:30pm. Additional program fees are noted below.





Many special events are featured throughout the year. Our most popular event is First Nations Drumming and Dancing on the Plaza, held each Wednesday throughout July and August. Visit our website for all special event listings.
