Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump stands out as a premier Indigenous tourism destination in Western Canada. Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1981, it has also been previously recognized by the Canadian Tourism Commission as a Signature Experience.



HISTORY AND HERITAGE

The site occupies the traditional territory of the Blackfoot-speaking people, also known as Niitsitapiiks. This sacred location celebrates an ancient hunting technique employed by the Plains people for millennia: herding bison and driving them over a cliff, an event known as the Buffalo Jump. Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump stands out as one of the oldest, largest, and best-preserved jumps, with a history dating back 7000 years.

LOCATION AND ACCESSIBILITY

Situated in Southwestern Alberta, Canada, just 90 minutes south of Calgary on Highway #2, Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump welcomes visitors year-round. Both the Interpretive Centre and the upper trail viewpoint are wheelchair accessible, ensuring that all visitors can enjoy the remarkable cultural and natural heritage of the site.

With over a decade of experience in the Travel Trade industry, Head-Smashed-In caters to both Group Tours and Fully Independent Travelers (FIT).
